SENTENCE COMPOSITION

[Exercise 1]

Read the people's thoughts and make sentences as in the example.
Use **Mixed Conditional**.

Example:

I should have warned you against going there. You are in trouble now.

Answer:

If I **had warned** you against going there, you **wouldn't be** in trouble now.

2. I should have predicted your answer. I am frustrated about your refusal now.

3. Miranda should have told me the truth at that time. I can't forgive her now.
