

Paraphrase the sentences to form Conditional type 2 or type 3

Paraphrase the sentences as in the example to make **Conditional sentence — type 2 or type 3**. Mind the punctuation.

Example:

They don't watch the news, so they don't know much about politics.

Answer:

If they **watched** the news, they **would know** much about politics.

OR

Example:

She didn't pick him up from school, so he walked home.

Answer:

If she **had picked** him **up** from school, he **would not have walked**.
